## **Story Risk Checklist**



Most news stories are harmless, even stories driven by professional criticism. Other stories involve a potential risk for the reporter or the source. You need to spot the difference between the two.

• This checklist reflects the most basic risk assessment automatically exercised professional journalists when working with a story idea. But it needs to be trained and kept fresh, even by senior reporters. So here is the tool for training individually, collegial or at editorial meetings.

Instruction: Ask yourself if the story in any way could be dangerous. If "Yes", then score the likeliness and possible danger from 1-4.

If the total equals 4 or above at any given line, you are advised to do a full risk assessment and coherent mitigation of risk.

If the Total is 5 or above, you should also make a safety plan – and maybe a contingency plan.

- If the story risks to harm you or your sources or to put your medium in danger, you need tools for further risk assessment: The "Critical Reporters' Checklist" or the "Event Risk Checklist".
- If not, do your story with your usual professional criticism and be alert throughout your research.

Formulate the story angle – as a claim of your possible finding. Then ask yourself:  Does the story?
